BUILDING THE FUTURE THROUGH MAJOR GIFTS

\$180 MILLION DONATION CREATES TOWER OF HOPE BRAIN AND HEART CENTER

Dr. Shmuel & Anat Harlap donated \$180 million—the largest ever gift to Israel’s healthcare system—to create a state-of-the-art brain and heart center at Rabin Medical Center. The Tower of

Hope will house advanced heart and brain centers, integrating clinical care, teaching, research, and innovative technologies.

The new center will add over 300 beds to existing capacity along with new surgical theaters, helping to bridge the gap between Israel and other Western countries in healthcare infrastructure. Scheduled to open in early 2027, the 15-floor, 750,000-square-foot facility will integrate advanced cardiology and neurology care, including national transplant units, cutting-edge surgical suites, and AI-assisted diagnostic systems. In addition to its 12 stories aboveground, the Tower of Hope will feature three fully fortified subterranean floors that will house operating rooms, imaging units, catheterization labs and intensive care wards for cardiology, cardiac surgery, and neurosurgery.

Anat and Dr. Shmuel Harlap, long time donors to Rabin Medical Center, emphasized the facility’s inclusive mission: “The Tower of Hope will serve all parts of Israeli society—secular, religious, Haredi, Muslim, Christian, Druze, and Circassian. The tower will be for all of us, a lighthouse of hope.”

\$35 MILLION DONATION CREATES THE SAMUELI INTEGRATIVE CANCER PIONEERING INSTITUTE

Henry and Susan Samuelli donated \$25 million to Israel’s Rabin Medical Center to create the Samuelli Integrative Cancer Pioneering Institute. Matched with an additional \$9 million from Clalit Health Services, this \$34 million donation is a major gift in Israel’s history both in size and purpose. The gift is focused primarily on funding research, with the goal that the findings will be shared around the world.

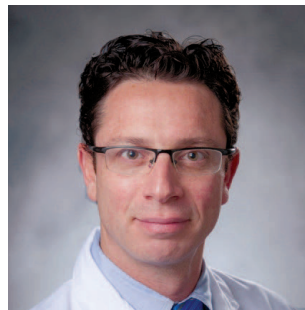
According to the Samuelis, the “true measure of success” for the institute will be how many of the new techniques, procedures, and guidelines that it develops are implemented at “leading institutes throughout the world.”

“We expect the Institute, under Dr. Markel’s leadership, to challenge existing care paradigms and create a better future for cancer patients inside of Israel and beyond,” the Samuelis said in a statement.

Throughout its history, Rabin Medical Center has been a pioneer in Israel’s healthcare system, introducing novel life-saving procedures, being the first in Israel to open new specialized departments and applying innovative techniques.

INNOVATIVE MEDICAL RESEARCH AT RABIN MEDICAL CENTER

Dr. Noa Eliakim-Raz and the Returning Hostage Ward Team create the first ever “Captivity Medicine” Protocol for treating released hostages.

Dr. Yael Graif conducted a study that linked asthma and migraines, suggesting that the two are significantly correlated.

Dr. Reut Tomashov-Matar co-developed a new blood test to diagnose genetic disorders in fetuses early in pregnancy by sequencing small amounts of DNA in the mother’s and father’s blood.

Dr. Omer Zarchi guided a breakthrough technology that maps the cerebral cortex during brain surgery. It won first prize at the Technion Faculty of Biomedical Engineering project fair.

Rabin Medical Center researchers collaborated with Microsoft Israel, using big data to predict and prevent falls in the elderly.

Dr. Yaron Barac was appointed Head of the Chest Transplantation Unit at Rabin, following his three-year AFRMC fellowship at Duke University Hospital.

Dr. Dror Dicker’s pilot trial of a drug-free, soft silicone nasal insert helped patients achieve weight loss goals.

Dr. Hadas Steiner’s sponsored delegation to Tanzania instructed local teams in emergency medicine.

Dr. Irit Bahar conducted clinical trials of synthetic corneal implants to correct corneal blindness.

Dr. Leor Perl inaugurated the Innovation Incubator Lab at Rabin Medical Center, which allows for the intersection of entrepreneurship and medical innovation.

Doctors at Rabin’s Division of Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery developed the first Cardiac Accessory Implant Surgery in Israel.

Rabin's heliport and vital services stand ready for all types of emergencies, while the hospital continually prepares itself against conventional, chemical, biological and all-out warfare. The 54,000 square foot Emergency & Trauma Center includes a Triage and Admittance section; a Fast-Track Clinic; imaging facilities and advanced diagnostic and life-saving equipment to cope with large scale disasters. Rabin Medical Center is a global leader in developing the capacity to safely assess, decontaminate, and treat victims of terrorist attacks and other disasters.

AFRMC FUNDS EMERGENCY MEDICAL NURSING STAFF



- **ICU TRAINING:** Education and training of nurses and physicians from other medical departments to treat incoming wounded soldiers and civilians in the ER/ICU.
- **PSYCHOLOGICAL, TRAUMA & COUNSELING SUPPORT:** Individual/group sessions with social workers, psychologists and mental health professionals to cope with intense stress and trauma.
- **TRAUMA & CRISIS HOSTAGE SUPPORT:** Critical training for health professionals, social workers and psychologists working with released hostages, including children and young adults. This support takes months, even years, to fully aid victims in their recovery.

RABIN MEDICAL CENTER'S HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS AROUND THE WORLD



Rabin Medical Center is always committed to humanitarian activities and believes deeply in providing help to communities around the world in need of medical aid.

Refugees from the war in Ukraine—both in Europe and in Israel—were provided essential medical aid by a humanitarian delegation of Rabin Medical Center's medical and nursing staff that joined task forces in Warsaw and Bucharest.

Within hours of when an earthquake struck the Middle East on February 7, 2023, Rabin Medical Center was one of the first countries that brought state-of-the-art rescue capabilities, field medical personnel and assets to help its neighbors.

While Israel is one of the smallest countries in the world, when it comes to humanitarian efforts, it is one of the largest.

RABIN MEDICAL CENTER'S REHABILITATION DEPT FOR WOUNDED ISRAELI SOLDIERS: WHERE INNOVATION AND REHAB JOIN FORCES

The Israel-Hamas War changed the landscape of rehabilitation. Since the start of the war, there have been over 37,000 wounded, and estimates claim that over 30,000 war casualties will require post-orthopedic rehabilitation. Just one month after the October 7 atrocities, Rabin Medical Center designed a dedicated Rehabilitation Department specifically for war casualties. Now, with thousands of wounded Israelis in need of long-term recovery treatment for months, and even years, to come, doctors need to rethink and redesign the concept of what "rehabilitative care" looks like.

Dr. Michael Bahar, Director of the Rehabilitation Department at Rabin Medical Center, stated that the war caught all Israeli Rehabilitation Wards with a massive shortage. The number of wounded far exceeded the capacity of most departments and it quickly became clear that not just physical space, but medical staffing, was becoming the greatest obstacle.

Dr. Bahar sees artificial intelligence as a critical next step in the field of rehabilitation:

"We are using AI in the treatment of wounded soldiers to monitor the possibility of developing post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). We have a lot of wounded, and a relatively small team to treat them. The fact that we can use an AI model to focus our treatment capabilities on those who really need it, is a huge advantage."

Dr. Leor Perl, Chief Innovation Officer at Rabin's Innovation Lab, agrees. Dr. Bahar partnered with Dr. Perl to transition to a more AI-focused rehabilitation program, giving the opportunity for patients to return home and continue their treatment.

Dr. Leor stated, "In times of uncertainty, we need to do better. A virtual hospital makes it possible to provide full care through virtual meetings. This requires using breakthrough and advanced technologies. A virtual hospital also provides a better service experience. Rehabilitation is a place where virtual possibilities provide real value."

THE INNOVATION LAB AT RABIN MEDICAL CENTER

WHERE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE MEETS MEDICINE

Our mission is to lead in the detection, research, development and implementation of urgent clinical needs

- The Innovation Center includes the “Innovation Incubator” that promotes inventions for particular needs, based on the bio-design method from Stanford BioDesign, as well as a center for artificial intelligence, big data, design, and 3D printing.
- Medical insights combined with internal research and development capabilities are leveraged by external entrepreneurs. One of the unique features of the Innovation Center is that research and development happens inside the hospitals.
- Dr. Leor Perl, head cardiac interventionist and chief innovation officer at Rabin Medical Center directs the Innovation Center, which is a group of professionals from different complementary backgrounds, ranging from business executives to senior physicians of all medical fields. Upon identification and research of a new unmet need, the center form specialized groups who are able to rapidly iterate, research and test new technological solutions within the hospital.

Ready for Any Scenario: Dr. Noa Eliakim-Raz, Co-Director, Returning Hostage Rehabilitation Clinic: *"We know how complex this process is for each individual. We have learned from past experiences and are prepared to handle any situation. These returning hostages are true heroes, and we are here to accompany them, step by step, restoring their strength, hope, and health."*

These Returning Hostages Are The True Heroes

Dr. Noa Eliakim-Raz, Co-Director, Returning Hostage Rehabilitation Clinic:

"As you all know, on October 7th 2023, 251 hostages were abducted, mostly civilians. They endured brutal captivity including physical, mental abuse, starvation and harsh conditions in underground captivity.

There is no such thing as a returning hostages ward. It is an unfortunate Israeli invention, and this is definitely not an ordinary ward. For over a year we built a never-before designed protocol. We created a new team with a new multidisciplinary ward working together as if we

all had been working together for many years, and got ready.

We have built a unique model—a gradual continuous rehabilitation model. It starts in the Returnees Ward, which is actually a transition space between captivity and freedom. The final stage is building a protocol for years to come.

One would think that people would return angry or accusing, but they are thankful and upright and that's incredible. You can see that despite everything, these people demonstrate great friendship, humanity, and strength—that is resilience, and for me it is inspiring. They defeat evil with humanity."

RABIN MEDICAL CENTER'S AMBULATORY REHAB CENTER



Rabin Medical Center is leading a critical initiative to tackle the severe shortage of rehabilitation facilities nationwide. Building on its medical skill and expertise during this war—and in response to one of Israel's most urgent healthcare needs—the hospital created:

THE AMBULATORY REHABILITATION CENTER

This comprehensive, interdisciplinary facility of over 1,700 meters delivers a full spectrum of outpatient therapies including personalized rehabilitative care supporting gait training, upper limb strength and coordination, and functional and cognitive training. It provides individually tailored treatment protocols, additional treatment modules for more patients and, using artificial intelligence, facilitates outpatient care for discharged patients.

With over 37,000 recovering wounded anticipated in the coming year, these cutting-edge technologies provide patients—wounded soldiers, civilians, and returning hostages—the utmost tools to rebuild physical strength, restore function, reclaim independence, and promote reintegration into daily life.


